is a Central Florida five year old who suffers with Rhabdoid Tumors. Malignant (cancerous) Rhabdoid tumors are rare, high grade tumors commonly occurring in children less than two years old. Dakota's Pineal Tumor is located on the 3<sup>rd</sup> ventricle in her brain. These tumors tend to be aggressive and frequently spread through the central nervous system. Dakota was responding well to radiation and chemotherapy when she came down with a life threatening sinus infection. Antibiotics had to be administered making it necessary for her chemo treatments to be halted. After recovering from the infection chemo was again started. Unfortunately Dakota did not respond to the new treatments and upon further testing another tumor was found. Due to the location of the tumor, surgery was impossible. The Doctors at Florida Hospital have done what they can for Dakota. Currently Dakota has been released from the hospital and sent home under Hospice care. Doctors have not held much hope for her recovery. The family is struggling financially due to extensive medical costs and the need of one parent to leave employment.
